
MARSHAL

(MAHR shul) v./n.

to assemble together for the purpose of doing something; also an officer in the police or military

Link: MARSHAL




"The **MARSHAL MARSHALED** a posse to capture the Waco Kid." (n./v.)

- MARSHALING their forces, the British defeated Rommel at El Alamein. (v.)
- □ The U. S. **MARSHAL** apprehended the suspect at the airport and took him into custody. (*n*.)
- □ The defense team **MARSHALED** its arguments before presenting them to the jury. (v.)

MARTYR

(MAHR tur) *n.* someone willing to sacrifice and even give his/her life for a cause; also one who pretends suffering to gain sympathy

Link: HARDER




"It's HARDER to be a MARTYR."

- She was a professional MARTYR, all-suffering for her children, or so she would tell them ten times a day.
- Joan of Arc was undoubtedly the most famous
 MARTYR in modern history, burned at the stake because she refused to go against her beliefs.
- Jack was a MARTYR to his job; he worked seven days a week and rarely took a day off.

MASTICATE

(MAS tih kayt) *v.* to chew

Link: MAST ATE




"Henry **ATE** the **MAST** when he started to **MASTICATE**."

- The doctor explained that a person's digestion is aided when they **MASTICATE** their food thoroughly.
- The Kiwi bird MASTICATES food before giving it to its young.
- The judge requested a recess to MASTICATE the facts presented by both the prosecution and the defense.

MELANCHOLY

(MEL un kahl ee) *n.* depression of spirits; gloomy; weary

"Farmer Brown was beset with **MELANCHOLY** when he saw what the worms had done to his **MELON** patch."

- Sitting in her living room and thinking of her late husband brought a touch of **MELANCHOLY** to Aunt Mildred's remembrances of Uncle John.
- The best word to describe Jim is **MELANCHOLY**; no matter the situation, he always walks around looking like he had lost his best friends.
- □ It was a **MELANCHOLY** day, gloomy and dark.

MENAGERIE

(muh NAJ uh ree) *n.* a collection of live wild animals on exhibit

Link: LINGERIE



- Busch Gardens has a wonderful MENAGERIE of lions, tigers, elephants, and other wild animals roaming free and on display in a park-like setting.
- To have a house pet is one thing, but Susan keeps so many parrots and cats in her house, it is a virtual MENAGERIE.
- With twelve children in the family, the Jacksons referred to their offspring as their MENAGERIE.

MIGRATORY

(MY gruh tor ee) *adj*. roving, wandering, nomadic

Link: MY STORY




"MY STORY is one of many MIGRATORY movements."

- Wild geese MIGRATE to Canada in the summers and Mexico in the winters.
- Most American Indian tribes in the Old West were MIGRATORY and followed the movements of the buffalo.
- Fruit pickers are **MIGRATORY** workers who move from place to place at harvesting time.

MILIEU (meel YOO) *n*. environment or surroundings

Link: MILDEW




"The boys' locker room showers were a **MILIEU** of **MILDEW**."

- After a long sea journey, a sailor on land for the first few days feels out of his MILIEU.
- The proper MILIEU for raising a family is a home setting with loving parents who understand child rearing; something every parent must work at and not take for granted.
- The New York Stock Exchange is a MILIEU of frenzied activity during trading hours.

MIRAGE

(muh RAJ) *n*. unreal reflection; an optical illusion

Link: GARAGE




"The **GARAGE** they thought they saw crossing the desert was only a **MIRAGE**."

- Her beauty was mostly a MIRAGE created by the art of cosmetics.
- Desert caravans often see MIRAGES on days when heat waves are reflected off the burning sands.
- The MIRAGE of the lake was a welcome sight to the parched desert traveler until he bent down to take a drink and got a mouthful of sand.

MISANTHROPY

(mis AN thruh pee) *n.* someone who hates mankind

Link: MISS ANTHROPY




"MISS ANTHROPY was a MISANTHROPIC person."

- A more **MISANTHROPIC** person you never did see. He hates everyone. (*adj.*)
- □ Adolph Hitler is known for his **MISANTHROPY**.
- Because of his **MISANTHROPY**, he retreated to the summit of a high mountain to live alone.

MISNOMER

(mis NOH mur) *n*. an incorrect or inappropriate name

Link: MISS HOMER



"What a **MISNOMER**, our little **MISS HOMER** struck out five times in a row."

- A nickname like "Speedy" is a MISNOMER when directed toward one who is slow at what they do.
- We usually have dinner at this very small Italian restaurant called The Spaghetti Factory, obviously a MISNOMER of major proportions.
- It was no MISNOMER when they called Harry Houdini, "The Great Houdini," as he was the greatest escape artist of his time.
