(kuh TOUR) *n.* fashion designers; clothes created by fashion designers

Link: FUTURE



"That's what we'll be wearing, the **COUTURE** of the **FUTURE**."



COWER

(KOW ur) v.

to cringe in fear; to shrink away

Link: COW




"Bessie, the **COWERING COW**, never could stand the sight of her own milk."

- When Sheriff Wild Bill Hickok entered the Last Chance Saloon, the villains COWERED in fear.
- □ The sound of the rusty door opening in the middle of the night made Sue COWER under her sheets.
- Jack COWERED in frustration just to think about coming home from vacation and finding all the homework he had to catch up on.

CRANNY

(KRAN ee) *n*. a small opening as in a wall or rock face

Link: **GRANNY**



"GRANNY got stuck in the CRANNY."

- □ The secret message was found stuffed into a small **CRANNY** in the courtyard wall next to the church.
- Rock climbers look for any CRANNY where they can get a secure foothold.
- We searched the house from top to bottom and never overlooked a single nook or CRANNY.

CRAVEN

(KRAY ven) *adj*. lacking the least bit of courage; cowardly

Link: RAVEN



"A CRAVEN RAVEN on the run"

- The soldier was full of bluster about how bravely he would fight, but his comrades later found him to be CRAVEN once the battle started.
- □ To let his wife do his fighting for him was the act of a **CRAVEN** husband with no backbone.
- □ The **CRAVENLY** act of the assassin, John Wilkes Booth, led to the death of President Lincoln.

CREDITOR

(KRED ih ter) *n.* a person or entity to whom money is owed

Link: **PREDATOR**



"Beware the CREDITOR who is a PREDATOR."

- Mr. Randolph's lawyer recommended he declare bankruptcy; he had too many CREDITORS and not enough assets with which to pay.
- CREDITORS usual charge interest on the money they loan.
- Visa, Master Card, and American Express companies are CREDITORS.

CRITERION

(kry TEER ee un) *n*. a standard or rule by which something can be judged; a basis for judgment

Link: LIBRARIAN




"A **CRITERION** for any **LIBRARIAN** is that she must know how to read."

- □ There is no special **CRITERION** for making a fortune, but some say the fastest way is to marry rich.
- CRITERION is singular. CRITERIA is plural.) The physical CRITERIA for a good basketball player are to be seven feet tall and jump like a kangaroo.
- □ The **CRITERION** for becoming a lawyer is graduating from law school and passing the state bar exam.

CUBISM

(KYOO biz um) *n.* a style of art in which the subject matter is portrayed by geometric forms, especially cubes


"By the look of these **CUBES**, you are an artist of the school of **CUBISM**."

- CUBISM is a style of art that stresses abstract structure at the expense of other pictorial elements by fragmenting the form of those objects that are to be depicted.

CURTAIL

(kur TALE) *v.* to truncate or abridge; to lessen, usually by cutting away from

Link: CAT TAIL




"Rex readies himself to CURTAIL the CAT'S TAIL."

- □ The chairman requested that we should **CURTAIL** any further discussion of women's rights until the women arrived.
- Sheriff McDougall CURTAILED all further night patrols east of the river until bullet-proof windows were installed in his patrol cars.
- Mike's knee injury CURTAILED his career as a professional football player.

CURVILINEAR

(kurv ah LIN ee ur) *adj*. formed, bound, or characterized by curved lines

Link: CURVY LINES



"The skater's **CURVY LINES** outlined her **CURVILINEAR** skating program."

- Squares and rectangles have no CURVILINEAR lines.
- Engineers have special instruments to lay out CURVILINEAR streets in subdivisions.
- □ The CURVILINEAR shape of sports cars makes them more aerodynamic, which gives them less drag and allows them to travel faster.

DAMPER

(DAM pur) *n.* one that depresses or restrains; a dulling or deadening influence

Link: **DAMP PAW**



"A **DAMP PAW** can put a **DAMPER** on a good time."

- The jury trial seemed to be going the way of the defense until an eyewitness put a **DAMPER** on the defendant's hopes by identifying him as the one who committed the crime.
- □ The family was excited about their vacation until their father put a **DAMPER** on their plans, saying he was sorry, but there was no money for a vacation this year.
- □ The unexpected rain put a **DAMPER** on plans to have a picnic at the beach.
